Work with state, local, and federal agencies and through other existing mechanisms to enhance the collection and sharing of data among government agencies pertaining to human trafficking, identify individuals and organizations engaged in human trafficking, and ensure that such data collection facilitates the confidentiality of information and protects the privacy of victims of human trafficking and iv.) Recommend policies that will facilitate effective and efficient collaborations between relevant state agencies, the community, business and industry, and public and private entities to prevent human trafficking and provide assistance to victims who are United States citizens or foreign nationals.)

Because the Supreme Court will not be able to process electronic vouchers until 2008, the amendment eliminates the requirement for court appointed counsel to submit waiver request vouchers via electronic voucher. To handle the additional workload that would be created by the receipt of waiver requests, the amendment authorizes the Executive Secretary to use up to \$150,000 of the amount provided for waiver costs to hire additional staff to process the waiver requests. Present statute requires convicted defendants to reimburse the Commonwealth for any costs incurred by the state for court-appointed attorneys, up to the limit set out in statute. This amendment continues this requirement for those convicted defendants whose counsel receives a waiver.)
