Any return required to be filed with the Tax Commissioner under this section shall be deemed to have been filed with the Tax Commissioner on the date that such return is delivered by the dealer to the commissioner of the revenue or the treasurer for the locality in which the dealer is located and receipt is acknowledged by the commissioner of the revenue or treasurer. The commissioner of the revenue or the treasurer shall stamp such date on the return, and shall mail the return to the Tax Commissioner no later than the following business day. The commissioner of the revenue or the treasurer may collect from the dealer the cost of postage for such mailing."

### **Explanation:**

(This amendment raises the threshold on taxable sales from \$1.3 million to \$30.0 million before a dealer is required to make accelerated sales tax payments. This shift will reduce the number of impacted dealers by 9,469 from 9,860, or a reduction of 96 percent at a total cost of \$104.7 million in revenues.)
