When calculating the retirement benefits payable under the Virginia Retirement System (VRS), the State Police Officers' Retirement System (SPORS), the Virginia Law-enforcement Officers' Retirement System (VaLORS), or the Judicial Retirement System (JRS) to any employee of the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions who is called to active duty with the armed forces of the United States, including the United States Coast Guard, the Virginia Retirement System shall:

- 1) utilize the pre-deployment salary, or the actual salary paid by the Commonwealth or the political subdivision, whichever is higher, when calculating average compensation, and
- 2) include those months after September 1, 2001 during which the employee was serving on active duty with the armed forces of the United States in the calculation of creditable service."

Explanation:

(This amendment allows the VRS to avoid penalizing employees called to active duty in the armed forces of the United States when calculating retirement benefits due under the VRS retirement programs.)

Page 594, following line 28, insert:

“i. Any member of the Judicial Retirement System (1) whose term expired, and (2) who was not reappointed to a new term during the current or next Session of the General Assembly, and (3) who is subsequently appointed to the same position by the Governor shall not be considered to have a break in service for retirement purposes. The appropriate employer shall pay the required member retirement contributions.”

Explanation:

(This amendment provides uninterrupted JRS services credit for judges who are not immediately re-elected.)
