When the anticipated general fund revenues for a fiscal year or years are less than three and one-half percent greater than the anticipated general fund revenues for the preceding fiscal year, the Governor shall submit a proposal for funding capital outlay projects from the general fund in an amount equivalent to at least two percent of the anticipated general fund revenues for the fiscal year or years, provided, however, that the proposed capital budget amount may be funded from alternative financing mechanisms, including, but not limited to, bonded indebtedness. The Governor shall submit such bill or bills for consideration by the General Assembly as are necessary to implement such alternative financings.

An election not to participate in the program shall be irrevocable and such employee shall be ineligible to participate in the program for the period of his continued employment by the Commonwealth.

Any eligible employee who enrolls in the program during the election period as provided for in paragraph c. of this section shall have his sick leave balances, as of the effective date of coverage in the program, converted to disability credits, as provided in §51.1-1103 of the Code of Virginia. Upon retiring directly from state service and receiving an immediate annuity, the eligible employee's unused disability credits shall be converted to service credit under the Retirement System at the rate of one month of service for each 173 hours of disability credits, rounded to the next highest month. Upon leaving state service under any other

circumstances, the employee shall be paid for the balance of such disability credits under the same terms and subject to the same conditions as were in effect for the payment of sick leave benefits in the employee's agency on December 31, 1998, unless he elects to have such credits converted to service credit under the Retirement System at the rate of one month of service for each 173 hours of disability credits, rounded to the next highest month."
