A. Included in Item 291, paragraph C 3 of this act is \$203,247 from the general fund and \$16,258 in nongeneral funds the first year and \$194,892 from the general fund and \$16,258 in nongeneral funds the second year to support the debt service on bonds issued by the Virginia College Building Authority to finance equipment. The Treasury Board shall transfer to the Virginia College Building Authority on July 1, 2000, the amounts in the first year, and on July 1, 2001, the amounts in the second year to support the Authority's debt obligation.

B. This appropriation authorizes University of Virginia's College at Wise to charge students a technology service fee in conformity with § 4-2.01 c of this act. This appropriation includes \$99,369 the first year and \$99,369 the second year from nongeneral funds, the unexpended balance of which shall not revert to the general fund in any fiscal year but shall be carried forward on the books of the Department of Accounts and allotted for expenditure each July 1. The Department of Planning and Budget shall allot technology fee revenues in excess of the amounts appropriated in this Item provided that the revenues are not generated by resident undergraduate students and provided that such revenues reflect a fee that does not exceed three percent of the total of tuition and required fees charged in FY 1998 to nonresident undergraduate students and three percent of the total of tuition and required fees charged in FY 1998 to graduate and professional students.

C. Out of this appropriation, \$30,000 the first year and \$30,000 the second year from the general fund is designated to support the Virginia Writing Program.
