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#### **REPORT OF THE SUBCOMMITTEE**

### on HIGHER EDUCATION

Mr. Chairmen and Members of the Committee:

On behalf of the Higher Education Subcommittee, I am pleased to offer budget recommendations that respond to the priorities of the institutions and advance our shared commitment to superior and affordable colleges and universities.

Our recommendations keep faculty salaries competitive with peer institutions, provide a greater investment in instructional and research equipment, increase student access to higher education, and keep the cost of going to college within the reach of all Virginians.

The subcommittee also recommends additional state support for certain core activities, such as administrative computing systems and safety and security improvements, as well as academic program enhancements in teacher preparation, technology education, workforce development, and life science education.

Finally, we recommend increasing the Tuition Assistance Grant from \$2,700 to \$3,000 a year by 2002.

Before leaving the area of higher education and moving on to what we call "other education," I want to recognize the valuable work of the Governor's Blue Ribbon Commission on Higher Education and the Joint Legislative Subcommittee on Higher Education Funding Policies. We appreciate their painstaking attention to issues of quality, accountability, and affordability in Virginia higher education.

As you know, the Joint Subcommittee on Higher Education Funding Policies is assessing the adequacy of each institution's base appropriation and developing guidelines for ongoing state support. The Subcommittee provided an interim report to members last December and will issue a final report later this year. Its work will provide one of the essential building blocks to long-term, stable funding for higher education.

Regarding the innovative and commendable proposal to develop institutional performance agreements, the subcommittee recommends a slower approach than that proposed by the Governor, allowing time for the development of funding guidelines, decentralization proposals, and additional performance measures before committing to long-term agreements. We look forward to working with the Governor this year and considering the proposal in light of additional information in the 2001 Session.

Beyond the area of higher education, our subcommittee recommends significant investments in the arts, humanities, and libraries. We recommend over \$1 million each for the Virginia Commission for the Arts and the Virginia Foundation for the Humanities. We are particularly pleased to recommend full funding of the formula for state aid to public libraries. This is a goal that we have worked toward for several years.

Now that we have reached the goal, it makes sense to be forward-looking and evaluate our future needs in light of technological advances and the ability of local communities to fund library services. Therefore, we have directed JLARC to review the formula with these considerations in mind. Finally, the subcommittee recommends that the Library of Virginia establish a construction grant program to assist public libraries with renovations and other facility improvements.

The details of the subcommittee's report are contained in the attachments. Committee staff will review our report and the attached listing of our recommendations in greater detail, and we hope it will be your pleasure to adopt the report.
