## REPORT OF THE SUBCOMMITTEE

### on

### **HIGHER EDUCATION**

Mr. Chairmen and Members of the Committee:

On behalf of the Higher Education Subcommittee, I am pleased to offer budget recommendations that meet the challenges of our current economic condition, yet keep our institutions strong and focused on the future.

Many of our recommendations simply restore funding, to the extent possible, to levels we established as appropriate last year; others meet prior commitments or fill second-year budget holes.

As important as budget restorations have become, we are fortunate that some of our recommendations allow us to do more than just tread water.

Our largest recommendation -- \$20 million -- represents a down payment on our new higher education funding guidelines. You will recall that the Joint Subcommittee on Higher Education Funding Policies last year studied the adequacy of each institution's base appropriation and developed guidelines for ongoing state support.

These guidelines, which we reported to the Committee last month, provide an objective framework for fair and predictable funding for higher education. We are excited to be able to recommend that the Committee take this important first step in using the guidelines to restore funding for higher education.

Of equal importance is our obligation to our college and university faculty. Our recommendations provide a faculty salary increase that will keep our colleges and universities genuinely competitive with the best in the nation.

The Higher Education Subcommittee also wanted to address concerns about the operation and maintenance of our classrooms and labs. The maintenance needs of our colleges and universities are well documented. Those pressures are made worse by the skyrocketing costs of fuel and energy. In an effort to provide clean and safe facilities for our students, we recommend authorizing the Boards of Visitors to assess a facility maintenance fee of up to \$1 per credit hour, or about \$30 a year for a full-time student. To the extent institutions choose to charge this fee, the revenue would be restricted to maintaining educational facilities.

The Subcommittee further recommends providing an additional \$3.3 million for student financial aid. This represents a 2 percent across-the-board increase.

Beyond the area of higher education, we recommend full funding of the formula for state aid to public libraries. You will recall that we achieved full funding last year. We are pleased that we can continue to meet our commitment to public libraries.

We also recommend funding to restore some of the cuts to the Library of Virginia and to our state-owned museums. These restorations are critical to the core functions of these institutions.

The details of the Subcommittee's report are contained in the attachments. Committee staff will review our report and the attached listing of our recommendations in greater detail, and we hope it will be your pleasure to adopt the report.
