2005 Report of the Economic Development and Natural Resources Subcommittee Walter A. Stosch. Chairman

Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee:

I am pleased to report the recommendations of the Economic Development and Natural Resources Subcommittee. I believe that the amendments before you will significantly improve our environment and will offer a new array of economic opportunities for our rural communities.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

The Governor in his introduced budget included a new initiative to encourage economic expansion in rural Virginia. *Virginia Works* incorporates many ideas that the Senate Finance Committee has championed over the years, including adequate funding for the Governor's Opportunity Fund, workforce development, greater investment in agriculture and forestry, industrial site redevelopment, and support for local tourism. The Subcommittee recommends \$16.9 million for the initiative.

The Subcommittee also fully supports the Governor's actions to boost spending for workforce training and to honor the commitment pledged to Infineon Technologies, Inc. for their major plant expansion.

In addition, the Subcommittee recommends \$440,000 for homeless programs, specifically to provide greater health, education, and mental health services for the more than 5,000 children who are in emergency shelter and transitional housing facilities and to assist in the development of single room occupancy units for adults with very low income or special needs.

NATURAL RESOURCES

Mr. Chairman, the protection and preservation of Virginia's natural resources is a constitutional obligation. It is an obligation that the Committee takes seriously.

To that end, the Subcommittee recommends a total of \$75.1 million for water quality programs. This is in addition to the \$32.4 million proposed in the introduced budget bill. The Subcommittee's recommendation will address point source pollution in the Chesapeake Bay watershed, the combined sewer overflow problems of the Cities of Richmond and Lynchburg, safe drinking water in Southwest Virginia, and water quality monitoring. But, the Subcommittee realizes that the resources to fulfill Virginia's commitment under the Chesapeake 2000 Agreement and the consent decree will require more. We look forward to working with other policy makers to develop the necessary funding mechanism.

The Subcommittee is also interested in protecting and preserving Virginia's historical resources and lands for recreational and economic purposes. The amendment package includes \$20.0 million for the Virginia Land Conservation Foundation to carry out these purposes as well as funding for the Department of Historic Resources to perform its mission.

Mr. Chairman, the Subcommittee has long supported Virginia's state parks and natural area preserves. We applaud and support the Governor for his \$2.2 million amendments. The Subcommittee recommends an additional \$3.2 million for these programs.

In closing, I would like to say that we believe in Virginia's future, and we believe our recommendations will help make that future better.

"D.1. The Governor is hereby authorized to allocate an amount not to exceed \$2,500,000 in any one fiscal year from the unappropriated balance, derived by subtracting the general fund appropriations from the projected general fund revenues in this act, to address unanticipated business or industrial development opportunities of regional significance that will benefit the state's economy and for which other funding is not then available. Any such allocation shall be made only upon the approval of the Regional Project Investment Board.

2. The Regional Project Investment Board shall advise the Governor on any unanticipated business or industrial development of regional significance requiring state financial assistance as described in this Item. The Board shall be chaired by the Secretary of Commerce and Trade, and shall include the Secretaries of Agriculture and Forestry, Finance, and Transportation or their designees. Before making any recommendation to the Governor, the Board shall consult with the Chairmen of the Senate Finance and House Appropriations Committees or their designees. As part of the consultation, the Board shall share with the two Chairmen or their designees all information available to the Board on the unanticipated business or industrial development project."

Explanation:

(This amendment authorizes the Governor to use up to \$2.5 million of the unappropriated general fund balance to address an unanticipated business or industrial development opportunity. The language establishes a Regional Project Investment Board to advise the Governor on such opportunities.)

(This amendment restores the general fund dollars (\$500,000) cut from the Department's Weights and Measures Program in FY 2004. Both agency Directors shall certify to the State Comptroller that the systems, processes and procedures are sufficient to provide each agency with adequate internal controls and comply with all applicable laws, rules and regulations of the Commonwealth and any applicable federal grants or contracts. Should either agency Director determine that a system, process or procedure prevents them from fulfilling their programmatic mission, they shall document this concern in writing to the State Comptroller, who shall recommend changes if any to accommodate the concern. An interagency agreement shall be entered into by July 1, 2005 stipulating any payment to be made by the Department of Minority Business Enterprise to the Department of Business Assistance for services rendered. Terms of such agreement are to be reflected in the Budget Bill submitted to the 2006 Session of the General Assembly."

Page 99, line 7, after "Works.", insert: "The Governor is authorized to adjust the amounts specified in this Item in order to match the general fund appropriations in each year. Unless indicated otherwise, the Secretary of Commerce and Trade shall provide a status report on the implementation of Virginia Works, including but not limited to the dollar amounts spent or obligated, the number of jobs created as a result of the program, the amount of local, federal or private money leveraged by Virginia Works, the number of persons trained, and the number of businesses created. "The Department of Housing and Community Development shall report to the Chairmen of the Senate Finance and House Appropriations Committees by December 28, 2004, on the site locations for the two Artisan Centers, the amounts of private and nonstate investment committed to each project, the schedule to have each center in operation entirely or through a phased-in approach, the management structure for each Center, and potential future financial obligations for the state."

Page 102, line 59, after "3.", insert:

"As a condition of appropriation for this Item, the Director shall provide the Chairmen of the Senate Finance and House Appropriations Committees a draft of the article of incorporation for review and comment."

Such incentive packages may be in the range of those offered by other states for such business incentive packages. The Partnership shall report its findings and recommendations to the Chairmen of the Senate Finance and House Appropriations Committees by December 28, 2005."
