## REPORT OF THE SUBCOMMITTEE on ELEMENTARY & SECONDARY EDUCATION

Mr. Chairmen and Members of the Committee:

The Elementary and Secondary Education Subcommittee is pleased to have had the opportunity to work collaboratively with the other Subcommittee Chairmen to ensure that major initiatives within the Commonwealth were addressed though the collective actions taken and reflected the 2005 House Budget.

To that end, the Subcommittee's top priority was to compensate public school teachers as well as to acknowledge the importance and career contributions made by retired teachers. While we encourage school boards and local governing bodies to continue their support, we wanted to at least ensure that together both active and retired teachers would receive compensation commensurate to state employees.

Therefore, in conjunction with the Compensation and Retirement Subcommittee, we are recommending almost \$46 million dollars for the state's share of a 2.5 percent salary increase for teachers and other SOQ related positions, effective December 1, 2005. In addition, we are recommending \$8.3 million dollars to fund an increase in the teacher retiree health care credit rate from two dollars and fifty cents per month up

to four dollars. This increase will advance the retiree teacher group rate up to the current rate allocated for retired state employees. These two initiatives, totaling \$54 million dollars, provide a blended balance of available resources to all of our teachers, both active and retired.

We also continue to believe we should reward the highest achievers in our teaching force. That is why we are recommending continuing full funding for bonuses to teachers receiving certification from the National Board for Teaching Standards.

Mr. Chairmen, I want to take this opportunity to thank Delegate Tata and his Compensation and Retirement Subcommittee for their hard work and help in achieving this compensation plan.

Turning to other recommendations, we believe that vocational education opportunities for students lag behind those offered through regular academia. We are recommending \$1.2 million dollars in additional funding for the state's vocational curriculum center and to provide additional vocational education equipment funds to all schools in the state.

Secondly, we are recommending that the state fund its share of costs of the various Industry Certification tests that students may elect to take in lieu the usual Standards of Learning tests in order to earn the required verified credits for graduation. This action continues to support the Board of Education's policy to pay for compulsory standardized tests.

These needed steps, will increase vocational education funding by \$1.5 million and help ensure that all curriculum tracks in education are afforded an opportunity to support the diverse needs of students.

The Subcommittee also recommends taking steps that will address the technical corrections that were not fully funded in the introduced budget. We are recommending adding \$3.8 million dollars in the second year to completely cover the shortfall in several direct aid accounts. However, given the fact that a majority of the school year will be finished by the time this budget is adopted by the General Assembly and signed by the Governor, we do not recommend partially funding the first year as was included in the introduced budget.

Lastly, Mr. Chairmen, we are recommending no state funding for new programs. While this was a difficult decision, it is important to stress that we must be fiscally prudent as we look toward next year's projected estimates for the required re-benchmarking process. Early preliminary estimates put the cost at a very minimum of \$1.2 billion. In light of that, we endeavor to plan conservatively.

I now would like for Committee staff to explain each of the Subcommittee's recommendations in more detail. I hope it will be the pleasure of the Committee to adopt our recommendations.
