# REPORT OF THE SUBCOMMITTEE on CAPITAL OUTLAY

Mr. Chairman and Members on the Committee:

Mr. Chairman, given the major capital outlay process and program that you initiated last session, the Capital Outlay Subcommittee's recommendations this year are modest.

First, the Subcommittee recommends \$12.2 million to expedite five significant higher education capital projects worth \$230 million in construction value. The five projects would start construction 12 months sooner than previously planned and would stimulate 3,400 new jobs and advance higher learning opportunities.

Second, the Subcommittee wanted to address proposed closure of Southeastern Virginia Training Center. Mr. Chairman, we received several presentations on this proposal from the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services. Frankly, we are not confident the Department has developed a thoughtful, caring, and realistic plan. One might question whether the fiscal crisis is being used as a means to prematurely advance a proposal that is not ready for prime-time.

Mr. Chairman, fiscal exigency should not result in poor public policy. Therefore, the Subcommittee recommends the following for Southeastern Virginia Training Center:

- First, rebuild and resize Southeastern Virginia Training Center as a 75-bed facility to serve the profound and severely disabled. This would be funded through the existing \$23.8 million provided in your bond package from last session;
- Second, begin construction of 12 community-based Intermediate Care Facilities in Health Planning Region V. The esti-

mated cost of these homes is about \$2.7 million and would be funded through the existing funding provided in your bond package from last session;

• Third, provide for an expedited process to fast track these two projects by directing the Governor, the Director, Department of Planning and Budget and the Director, Department of General Services, to suspend the regular capital outlay process and initiate an expedited, fast track capital outlay process to ensure the timely availability of both Southeastern Virginia Training Center and the community-based homes. The Governor's expedited process shall be submitted to the Chairman for approval by July 15, 2009.

Finally, Mr. Chairman, with respect to the Southeastern Virginia Training Center recommendation, this is the third attempt to move this project along. We have previously provided planning funds, full project funds, held countless meetings, and the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services has failed to move this project forward. Therefore Mr. Chairman, the Subcommittee recommends we place control of this project under the Department of General Services.

The remaining recommendations provide \$13.7 million in Virginia Public Building Authority and Virginia College Building Authority bonds for prior project commitments, of which \$6.5 million would be used to construct the Education Wing of the Virginia War Memorial. As you recall, this project was included in the previous capital budget as a Treasury loan contingent on private fund raising efforts. In addition, the Subcommittee also recommends a \$2.6 million increase in the maintenance reserve program to address infrastructure and repair projects. Finally, the Subcommittee recommends the use of \$51.9 million of nongeneral funds at our colleges and universities for projects supported by gifts, federal funds or auxiliary enterprises.

In terms of savings, Mr. Chairman, the Subcommittee was able to generate \$7.6 million in debt service savings which can be directed to other priorities of the Committee.

The details of the Subcommittee's report are contained in the attachments. Committee staff will review our recommendations in greater detail, and we hope it will be your pleasure to adopt the report.

- 1. Subject to the provisions of this act, the General Assembly authorizes the University of Mary Washington to enter into a written agreement or agreements with the University of Mary Washington Real Estate Foundation (UMWREF) to support student housing projects and/or operational-related facilities through alternative financing agreements including public-private partnerships.
- 2. The University of Mary Washington is further authorized to enter into written agreements with UMWREF to support such student housing facilities; the support may include agreements to (i) include the student housing facilities in the University's students housing inventory; (ii) manage the operation and maintenance of the facilities, including collection of rental fees if those students occupied University-owned housing; (iii) assign students to the facilities in preference to other University-owned facilities; (iv) seek to obtain police power over the student housing as provided by law; and (v) otherwise support the students housing facilities consistent with law, provided that the University's obligation under any documents or other instruments constituting or securing bonds or other indebtedness of the University or the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- 3. The General Assembly further authorizes the University of Mary Washington to enter into a written agreement with a public or private entity to design, construct, and finance a facility or facilities to provide additional student housing and/or

operational-related facilities. The facility or facilities may or may not be located on property owned by the Commonwealth. The University of Mary Washington is also authorized to enter into a written agreement with the public or private entity to lease all or a portion of the facilities. The State Treasurer is authorized to make Treasury loans to provide interim financing for planning, construction and other costs of any of the projects. Revenues bonds issued by or for UMWREF will provide construction and/or permanent financing.

4. The University of Mary Washington is further authorized to convey parcels of land to the UMWREF, which will develop the land for the purpose of establishing residential housing for students and/or faculty and staff, office, retail, and other commercial land uses in accordance with the University's approved Master Plan."

- 2. the Director, Department of Planning and Budget, shall transfer \$23,800,000 of the amount appropriated in Chapter 1, 2008 Acts of Assembly, Special Session I for project 17458 (Repair/Replace Southeastern Virginia Training Center) for the purpose stated in paragraph A.1. of this item;
- 3. the Department of General Services, with the cooperation and support of the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services (DMHMRSAS), shall build, acquire, or renovate 12 community-based Intermediate Care Facilities (ICF-MR) in Health Planning Region V. Priority should be given to projects which can be completed on existing state-owned property within Health Planning Region V;
- 4. the Director, Department of Planning and Budget shall transfer \$2,700,000 of the

amount appropriated in Chapter 1, 2008 Acts of Assembly, Special Session I for project 17457, (Repair/Replace Central Virginia Training Center) for the purpose stated in paragraph A.3. of this item.

- 5. The Governor, the Director, Department of Planning and Budget and the Director, Department of General Services, shall suspend the regular capital outlay process and initiate an expedited, fast track capital outlay process to ensure the timely availability of both the rebuilt and resized Southeastern Virginia Training Center and the 12 community-based Intermediate Care Facilities (ICF-MR) in Health Planning Region V. The Governor's expedited process shall be submitted to the Chairmen of the House Appropriations and Senate Finance Committees for approval by July 15, 2009.
- B. The Department of General Services (DGS), with the cooperation and support of the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services (DMHMRSAS), shall examine the potential uses for the Southeastern Virginia Training Center property and report on such uses to Chairmen of the House Appropriations and Senate Finance Committees by November 1, 2009."
