2011 Report of the Economic Development and Natural Resources Subcommittee The Honorable Mary Margaret Whipple, Chairman February 6, 2011

Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee:

Since this time last year, we have seen Virginia's economy turn the corner and slowly but steadily improve. However, as you all know, Virginia still has an unemployment rate of 6.7 percent statewide, with some areas still in the double digits.

We have embraced the recommendations of the Governor's Commission on Economic Development and Job Creation and you will see in the amendments we recommend to you nearly \$36.5 million in new spending for economic development. I would also note that we include in our revenue assumptions \$10.3 million less from the passage of tax credits for research and development, winery and vineyard development, and incentives to encourage imports and exports through the Port of Virginia. We have also reported legislation to encourage commercialization of emerging technologies and grants for producing clean energy.

Small businesses are the key to our economic recovery and job creation. To that end, we endorse the Governor's recommendation to recapitalize the Small Business Financing Authority and have also included language to allow the authority greater capacity to guarantee loans.

Revitalization of historic downtowns, former industrial sites and economically distressed areas is equally important to our efforts. We support all of the Governor's amendments in these efforts and have included additional funding for brownfield redevelopment as well as fully funding the Enterprise Zone Grant Program. I would add that over half of the recipients of Enterprise Zone grants are small businesses with 50 or fewer employees, and over 70 percent are companies with 100 or fewer employees.

Mr. Chairman, at this time each year I like to take this opportunity to remind the Committee that Article XI of the Constitution of Virginia requires us to ensure that our citizens enjoy clean air and pure water, and compels us to conserve public lands and historic sites. While we put substantial resources into economic development, it is even more important to ensure that we balance growth in the Commonwealth with protection of our vital natural resources.

Our budget includes an additional \$32.8 million for nonpoint source water pollution control. We are pleased to recommend that out of this amount, \$27.8 million be deposited into the Natural Resources Commitment Fund for agricultural best management practices to reduce nutrient and sediment runoff from farms. Also, we are recommending \$107.9 million in VPBA financing to honor the Commonwealth's commitment to public wastewater treatment projects that are already under construction. As the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency has recently accepted our Watershed Implementation Plan, now is the time to demonstrate our continued commitment to restore the Chesapeake Bay and reduce pollution in the Commonwealth's rivers, lakes, and streams.

Over the past three years, as with all of state government, the agencies under the Secretaries of Natural Resources and Agriculture and Forestry have endured significant budget cuts. As our revenue outlook improves, it is critical that we begin to restore funding to these agencies. To that end, we are recommending modest increases in funding for State Parks, Natural Area Preserves, Soil and Water Conservation Districts, Dam Safety, and the Department of Forestry. We also endorse the Governors efforts on land conservation and have added additional funding for farmland preservation.

In closing, I would like to say that we have a strong faith in Virginia's future, and we believe our recommendations will help make that future brighter for our economy, for our environment, and for our citizens.

Mr. Chairman, this completes the report of your subcommittee.
