2012 Report of the Economic Development and Natural Resources Subcommittee The Honorable John Watkins, Chairman February 19, 2012

Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee:

Since last year, we have seen Virginia's economy continue to slowly but steadily improve. Virginia's statewide unemployment rate has decreased from 6.7 percent at this time last year to 6.2 percent as of January 2012, and remains well below the national average. Virginia's business-friendly environment, combined with our low tax rates and proactive economic development efforts will continue to contribute to our success.

We have embraced the recommendations of the Governor's introduced budget for Commerce and Trade and you will see in the amendments we recommend total net funding of \$125 million for economic development incentives. However, we have also identified opportunities to provide savings to help address more pressing priorities in other areas of state government.

As we all know, the entire nation is facing uncertainty due to the debate in Congress over reducing the federal budget deficit. The Governor has proposed capitalizing a Federal Action Contingency Trust Fund to help address the potential impact on the Commonwealth from proposed federal budget reductions. We agree with the Governor's recommendation to create the FACT Fund. However, we are recommending amendments to allow a portion of the fund to be used to address immediate needs related to federal facility closures. We are also recommending contingent appropriations from the fund for discretionary items if it is determined that federal budget cuts will not have a significant adverse impact on the Commonwealth.

Small businesses are the key to economic recovery and job creation. To that end, we are providing funding for legislation passed by the Senate to establish a Small Business Investment Grant Fund to assist businesses with less than 50 employees, as well as a Microenterprise Investment Grant Fund to assist businesses with fewer than ten employees.

Mr. Chairman, I would like to take this opportunity to remind the Committee that Article XI of the Constitution of Virginia requires us to ensure that our citizens enjoy clean air and pure water, and compels us to conserve public lands and historic sites. While we put substantial resources into economic development, it is even more important to ensure that we balance growth in the Commonwealth with protection of our vital natural resources.

Our budget includes a total of \$44.1 million for agricultural best management practices to reduce nutrient and sediment runoff from farms. As you know, the Senate has passed legislation to provide \$300 million in bonds to honor the Commonwealth's commitment to public wastewater treatment projects and \$78 million for combined sewer overflow projects. As we move forward with our Watershed Implementation Plan, now is the time to demonstrate our continued commitment to restore the Chesapeake Bay and reduce pollution in the Commonwealth's rivers, lakes, and streams.

In addition, we recommend funding to restore proposed cuts to Soil and Water Conservation Districts, State Parks, and the Virginia Land Conservation Fund. We are also providing funding for the Marine Resources Commission to restore the Saltwater Sport Fishing Tournament, to enhance oyster restoration efforts, and to continue the marine debris removal program.

In closing, we believe our recommendations provide a balance to continue moving our economy forward while also protecting our environment, and providing resources to fund services in other areas of the budget to ultimately benefit our citizens.

Mr. Chairman, this completes the report of your subcommittee.

3. Prior to the distribution of any funds from the Federal Action Contingency Trust (FACT) Fund, the Governor shall consult with the advisory committee regarding the purpose of any proposed distribution and seek the advisory committee's guidance. The advisory committee shall respond to the Governor within five days after receiving a proposal from the Governor indicating their guidance to him about the proposed distribution. The Governor shall also notify the chairmen of the Senate Finance Committee and the House Appropriations Committee in writing within ten days concerning his decision to distribute money from the FACT reserve having previously received guidance from the advisory committee.

4. If the U.S. Congress substantially delays or amends the automatic \$1.2 trillion in federal budget reductions scheduled to take effect in January 2013 pursuant to the Budget Control Act of 2011; and, the Governor and the advisory committee determines that the result of any such action will not significantly impact the Commonwealth's revenues, certain contingent appropriations as identified in Item 105 of Senate Bill 30 (2012) shall be provided from the Federal Action Contingency Trust (FACT) Fund."

The stakeholder group is directed to conduct a review of the following and make recommendations to the Governor and the Chairmen of the Senate Finance Committee and the House Appropriations Committee no later than October 1, 2012:

a. The historical distribution of funding for administration and operations of all Soil and Water Conservation Districts and a projection of future funding needs and any recommended changes to the methodology for distribution of these funds;

b. The historical distribution of funding for technical assistance for agricultural best management practices and a projection of future funding and staffing needs for districts necessary to provide efficient and effective technical assistance to farmers.

c. Operational and technical assistance needs in relation to the amount of agricultural

best management practices cost-share dollars allocated to the districts; and,

d. The process, timing and methodology for distribution of agricultural best management practices cost-share funds to be provided to farmers by the Department of Conservation and Recreation through the districts."

(This amendment restores operational funding for the 47 Soil and Water Conservation Districts. The introduced budget proposed a 46 percent cut to SWCD operational funding. The SWCD support is critical to the implementation of Virginia's Watershed Improvement Plan for the Chesapeake Bay as well as the Southern Rivers TMDL. The districts provide the network to market and distribute the agricultural best management practices cost-share program with the agricultural community. It is the intent of the General Assembly that during enrolling of the budget separate service areas be created to clarify the amounts for SWCD operations and SWCD technical assistance.)

The regulations adopted by the State Air Pollution Control Board to initially implement the provisions of this Item shall be exempt from Chapter 40 of Title 2.2, Code of Virginia, and shall become effective no later than July 1, 2012. Thereafter, any amendments to the fee schedule described by these acts shall not be exempted from Chapter 40 of Title 2.2, Code of Virginia."

(This amendment authorizes the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) to enact regulations that assess charges related to the Title V program. Out of the appropriation for this item, \$20,000,000 the second year from the general fund is provided to further capitalize a reserve to be known as the Federal Action Contingency Trust (FACT) Fund. The Governor is authorized to distribute amounts from this reserve to mitigate or address a variety of negative impacts of federal fiscal actions on the Commonwealth. Although not specifically limited to the following, the Governor may use this reserve to address the replacement of losses of direct federal grant funding, to provide incentives to retain or consolidate federal facilities in Virginia, to address federal tax policy changes from conformity that are deemed undesirable, and to assist businesses impacted by the cutback of federal procurement or defense contracts obtain new alternative customers.
