REPORT OF THE SUBCOMMITTEE on GENERAL GOVERNMENT

Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee:

Consistent with the guidance we received from our Chairman, the General Government Subcommittee's mission this session has been a continued emphasis on analyzing the budget for the seat of government to identify savings and opportunities to streamline government that do not negatively impact the necessary operations of government or the lives of our citizens.

With this goal in mind the subcommittee reviewed and approved proposals included in Governor McDonnell's budget to consolidate agencies, eliminate or consolidate boards and commissions, cut the payment of dues for membership in redundant governmental organizations, and implement efficiencies in the general administration of government.

The subcommittee's work built on these proposals to identify additional savings and efficiencies. This included a detailed analysis of agencies' cash balances and needs. After this work, I am pleased to announce that the subcommittee's recommendations include balance reversions, revenue transfers, and expenditure reductions which result in additional resources in excess of \$32 million over the three years, including \$2.8 million in savings within the legislative agency budgets.

We identified these savings based on a genuine desire to increase the ability of this committee as a whole to make investments in our health safety net, education funding, employee compensation and other core needs.

While much of our subcommittee's energy this session was spent identifying savings, we did spend a significant amount of time focusing on the needs of our judicial branch. The subcommittee examined the judicial vacancies and the current caseloads for each individual circuit or district. After considerable discussion and analysis, we are recommending that you authorize the filling of approximately two-thirds of the judgeships which are currently frozen. Of equal importance, we are recommending \$240,000 in funding for the Supreme Court to contract with an independent entity to develop a detailed, systematic method to improve our ability to determine the appropriate allocation of judgeships in the future.

In addition, we are delighted to recommend funding of \$3.2 million over the biennium for 46 additional staff positions in our district courts' clerks offices. We strongly feel that these additional positions are an important investment to ensure the continued successful operation of our court system.

The most significant spending recommendation of the subcommittee is the recommendation to include \$300 million for deposits into the rainy day fund during the 2012-14 biennium. These deposits will double the amount of cash in the rainy day fund from the current \$300 million to \$600 million. We view the replenishment of the rainy day fund as a vitally important action given the economic uncertainty we continue to face.

Lastly, Mr. Chairman, I would like to thank you for your support and all of the members of the subcommittee for all their hard work during this session. Mr. Chairman and fellow Committee members, I will ask staff to take you through our detailed recommendations, and then I hope it will be your pleasure to adopt our Subcommittee report.
