2015 Report of the Transportation Subcommittee The Honorable Frank W. Wagner, Chairman February 8, 2015

Mr. Chairmen and Members of the Committee:

Your Transportation subcommittee strived this year to prioritize oversight of existing transportation investments and identify targeted investments in transportation alternatives, recognizing that transparency and accountability in expenditures are critical to maintaining public confidence in Virginia's transportation program.

Throughout the session, the subcommittee heard testimony on the need to enhance oversight of projects initiated under the Public Private Transportation Act as well as the challenges facing our state and local transportation agencies, with respect to funding formulas. These topics are included in legislation that will be before the Committee in the coming weeks.

In the years since the passage of legislation that fundamentally transformed transportation funding, the revenue forecast and assumptions that were used in preparing that legislation have changed substantially. With the revenues for transportation programs approximately \$1.0 billion less than what was initially forecast, you will see that the subcommittee has largely resisted efforts to carve-out revenues for specific projects.

The proposals of the transportation subcommittee focus on providing direct funding to the Joint Commission on Transportation Accountability, establishing a regulatory framework for transportation network companies such as Uber and Lyft, ensuring fair competition among bids for highway projects, and advancing the critical planning of forward-looking investments to provide mobility options before regional gridlock strangles the communities of Hampton Roads.

Mr. Chairman, this completes the report of your Transportation Subcommittee.

"The Joint Commission on Transportation Accountability shall regularly review and provide oversight of the usage of funding generated pursuant to the provisions of House Bill 2313 of the 2013 Session of the General Assembly. To this end, by November 15 of each year, the Secretary of Transportation, the Northern Virginia Transportation Authority, and the Hampton Roads Transportation Accountability Commission shall each prepare a report on the uses of the Intercity Passenger Rail Operating and Capital Funds, the Northern Virginia Transportation Authority Fund, and the Hampton Roads Transportation Fund, respectively, to be presented to the Joint Commission on Transportation Accountability.

Authority: Senate Bill 1213 of the 2015 General Assembly."

Explanation:

(This amendment provides \$28,200 the second year from the general fund for legislative compensation and travel expenses for the members of the Joint Commission on Transportation Accountability, which was created pursuant to HB 3202 of the 2007 Session. Staffing was originally provided by JLARC, but staffing is currently provided by the Division of Legislative Services.)

"N. Prior to November 15, 2015 the Secretary of Transportation shall report to the Chairmen of the House Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Finance on the Commonwealth's total contribution to the construction of the

Downtown Tunnel / Midtown Tunnel / MLK Extension Project in the Hampton Roads District in addition to funding provided in the initial comprehensive agreement. Included in this report, the Secretary shall assess the potential costs and feasibility of, as well as identify potential funding sources for, elimination of all tolls levied on users of the facility in support of the existing comprehensive agreement."

(This amendment directs the Secretary of Transportation to evaluate potential options and funding sources for the elimination of tolls levied on users of the Downtown - Midtown Tunnel project.)

allocated \$1,900,000 in the second year to conduct a transit study in the cities of Hampton and Newport News for (i) corridor planning to identify potential areas for high capacity, fixed guideway transit connectivity, (ii) defining areas of high commercial and residential growth and density as well as areas limited by increasing roadway congestion, and (iii) evaluation of options that will define transit needs and possible alignment and technology solutions on the Peninsula with consideration given to future transit connectivity options to other cities in the Hampton Roads region."

Explanation:

(This amendment directs the Commonwealth Transportation Board to reserve funding from the Mass Transit Fund in support of the assessment and planning of future fixed guideway transit service between areas of high density commercial and residential populations in Hampton Roads and Newport News.)

"E. Prior to November 15, 2015 the Director of the Department of Rail and Public Transportation shall report to the Chairmen of the House Committees on Appropriations and Transportation and the Senate Committees on Finance and Transportation on the feasibility of increasing utilization of private operators and independent contractors, including but not limited to transportation network companies, in the provision of paratransit services throughout the Commonwealth. Included in this assessment, the Department shall determine the potential costs and feasibility of, as well as identify potential liability and risks associated with, increasing the provision of paratransit services through private providers."

(This amendment directs the Department of Rail and Public Transportation to analyze the potential opportunities for providing paratransit services through private operators and contractors.)

Page 408, following line 52, insert:

"J. Notwithstanding any other provision of law or policy, the Department shall maintain a policy of competitive procurement in storm drain applications. Technical determination of pipe design and materials shall be based upon sound engineering principles as specified by the Department or the engineer of record. When multiple pipe materials satisfy such technical criteria for a relevant project application, any otherwise sufficient bid specifying one or more of such pipe materials shall be allowed. No later than November 1 each year the Department shall submit a report to the Chairmen of the House Committees on Appropriations and Transportation and the Senate Committees on Finance and Transportation detailing any project bids during the previous year for which multiple pipe materials satisfying the technical criteria are bid and the Department or engineer of record has determined that a higher priced material should be procured."

(This amendment requires the Department of Transportation to maintain its current policy of competition in qualifying pipe material, and to annually report on any deviation.)

"F. Not later than August 15, 2015 and each year thereafter, the Department is hereby directed to publish for each construction district the amount of funding allocated for secondary road maintenance by individual jurisdiction as well as calculate and publish for each district the amount that would be allocated for secondary road maintenance in each individual jurisdiction on the basis of registered vehicles in each locality. The Department of Motor Vehicles shall provide any technical assistance and vehicle registration data required to complete the report."

Explanation:

(This amendment requires the Department of Transportation to annually publish

the actual amount of secondary road maintenance funding provided in each jurisdiction of the Commonwealth compared to the amount that would be provided if the allocation were based on the number of registered vehicles.)
