## REPORT OF THE SUBCOMMITTEE on HIGHER EDUCATION

Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee:

Mr. Chairman, before preparing my comments for today I consulted with the sage of St. Louis, Yogi Berra, who once said, "When you come to a fork in the road, take it." Mr. Chairman, we are at a fork in the road with higher education. We cannot continue traveling the well-worn path littered with yesterday's ideas. The Subcommittee's budget recommendations and work this session reflect a change in direction with the ultimate goal to improve affordable access to our public colleges and universities.

With that in mind, Mr. Chairman, the Subcommittee recommends amendments that provide for the following:

- Changing the way budget reductions are allocated to public colleges and universities to reflect total educational and general (E & G) budget as well as minimizing and equalizing the impact on in-state students;
- \$20 million in budget reduction relief distributed to improve the general fund support for in-state undergraduates and minimizing overall E & G impact to less than 1.4 percent for all institutions; and
- \$17.9 million for a three percent salary increase for all classified, faculty and university staff with general fund

allocations reflecting institutional salary actions unilaterally taken in 2017. I want to thank Mr. Poindexter for his work on this issue. Mr. Chairman, thank you for your leadership in making this possible for our hard working state employees.

These recommendations also eliminate any proposed reductions for extension and the Virginia Institute for Marine Science. In addition, the reductions exempt the research programs that we have supported in recent years.

Mr. Chairman, the Subcommittee also recommends the creation of the Online Virginia Network Authority pursuant to our House Bill 2262 this session. The amendment transfers the funding provided last session in SCHEV to the new Authority and, thanks to you Mr. Chairman, provides an additional \$1 million in 2018. I want to commend George Mason and Old Dominion Universities for taking a leadership role the last three years on this initiative. It's a new day in Virginia higher education. We must look to break down walls created by geography, time and ultimately cost, to deliver quality programs to our citizens. This online initiative has that potential. And we must see it succeed.

In addition to these funds, Mr. Chairman, the Subcommittee addressed state policy with an eye on affordability with two key pieces of legislation. First, the Subcommittee passed legislation to change the way the Commonwealth provides financial aid in order to incentivize students to complete their degrees in four years. Less time to degree completion should result in less student debt. Second, thanks to your leadership Mr. Chairman, the Subcommittee addressed the long-standing issue of out-of-state enrollment. Under the new policy, institutions that exceed thirty percent out-of-state students would be required to use the excess net revenues to lower the in-state tuition

cost. I would be remiss if I did not acknowledge the long-time efforts of our colleagues Dave Albo and Tim Hugo to push this issue.

Mr. Chairman, in recent years we have reformed athletic fees, financial aid and provided greater autonomy with the goal to make higher education more efficient. These recommendations will continue to build on our recent successes and offer Virginia students more opportunities to get a high quality, affordable education.

Mr. Chairman, details of our Subcommittee recommendations are attached. Committee staff will review our report and the attached listing of our recommendations in greater detail and I hope that it will be the pleasure of the Committee to adopt them.
