

# REPORT OF THE SUBCOMMITTEE

on

# COMMERCE, AGRICULTURE, and NATURAL RESOURCES

Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee:

The scope of the Subcommittee on Commerce, Agriculture, and Natural Resources is very broad. While there is a lot of detail in this report, I want to highlight the very important work done by the Subcommittee, particularly in the areas of expanding broadband to unserved areas, making key investments to strengthen the resiliency of our economy, and improving water quality throughout the Commonwealth.

In the area of Commerce, our current public health crisis has magnified the need for access to broadband for students, workers, and businesses. To meet this challenge head on, the Subcommittee recommends a historic investment in the Virginia Telecommunications Initiative totaling close to \$100.0 million over the biennium to expand broadband infrastructure across the state. Additionally, the Subcommittee supports the creation of a broadband map so that we can better understand the areas of greatest need and deploy our resources from the VATI program in the most cost-effective manner possible.

The Subcommittee report also includes the creation of a new Secretary of Labor for the Commonwealth and provides corresponding resources for that Office. The Secretariat will bring new focus to Virginia's agencies charged with representing and protecting workers, such as the Virginia Employment Commission, the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation, and the Department of Labor and Industry. To provide paid sick leave for essential workers, the Subcommittee recommends allocating over \$400,000 to the Department of Labor and Industry to carry out this policy.

The Subcommittee report contains \$10.0 million in funding for the Virginia Employment Commission to enhance their customer service operations through July 1, 2022 and provides much needed services to workers impacted by the pandemic. Additionally, the report before you includes \$5.0 million for the Commission to finish modernizing its IT systems to better serve individuals in need of unemployment insurance.

The Subcommittee report contains close to \$12.0 million in initial incentive payments for the Microsoft and CMA CGM economic development projects approved by the MEI Commission. Microsoft will invest \$64 million and create 1,500 jobs in Fairfax County by creating a new software research and development hub. Announced last week, CMA CGM, which is a large shipping and logistics company, will expand its operations in Hampton Roads and Northern Virginia, and create 415 additional jobs in the state. Additionally, the Subcommittee supports a \$10.0 million investment to help the City of Petersburg upgrade water capacity to support the creation of a pharmaceutical manufacturing hub for the region.

In the area of Natural Resources, the Subcommittee report includes a substantial commitment to the Commonwealth's efforts to meet its nutrient reduction goals under the Phase III Watershed Implementation Plan. This includes a total deposit of \$69.4 million in the Water Quality Improvement Fund, of which \$65.0 million is direct toward Agricultural Best Management Practices, as well as the continued provision of stable technical assistance funding for our local Soil and Water Conservation Districts. To support our localities with critical funding for stormwater infrastructure improvements, the Subcommittee recommends an additional \$26 million be deposited in the Stormwater Local Assistance Fund.

The Subcommittee also supports the Governor's efforts to begin to address historic wrongs. This includes support in the amount of \$5.0 million to establish the Harmony Living Shoreline Memorial, and to assist in the repatriation of headstones and other materials of the former Columbian Harmony Cemetery to the New Harmony Cemetery. The report also provides \$3.5 million to support the Chickahominy Tribe in

their efforts to procure a parcel of land that historically belonged to the Tribe.

Finally, the Subcommittee recognizes that the success of our natural resources and conservation programs relies our hard working professional staff. The Subcommittee recommends restoring \$12.0 million for additional positions and equipment in the Department of Environmental Quality's water protection, air protection, and land protection programs. The Subcommittee also recommends providing an additional \$3.0 million for the Department of Conservation and Recreation to increase staffing and make improvements at our State Parks and Natural Area Preserves.

The Subcommittee's report is contained in the attachment before you, and I hope it will be the Committee's pleasure to adopt the report.
