REPORT OF THE SUBCOMMITTEE on HIGHER EDUCATION

Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee:

The Subcommittee's budget recommendations this session reflect the ultimate goal to maintain affordable access to our public colleges and universities. The recommendations are focused on providing our public colleges and universities with the necessary funding and tools to manage through the fiscal uncertainty caused by the pandemic.

With that in mind, Mr. Chairman, the Subcommittee recommends amendments that will provide for the following in fiscal year 2022:

- \$84.0 million to maintain affordable access which includes \$24.0 million for George Mason and Old Dominion Universities;
- \$34.5 million in federal funding to allow colleges and universities to conduct COVID testing;
- \$36.0 million to begin the implementation of the G-3 workforce program at the VCCS. These funds will provide "last dollar" financial aid to eligible students to pay for tuition, fees and books in five program areas: technology, health care, public safety, early childhood education, and manufacturing and skilled trades. This includes \$1.5 million for outreach efforts related to the program; and
- \$30.3 million in in-state undergraduate financial aid.

In addition, the subcommittee is pleased to recommend \$7.5 million in additional funding for cancer research at the University of Virginia and Virginia Commonwealth University.

The Subcommittee also recommends \$8.0 million for Radford to allow for the reduction of tuition costs at the Carilion Campus. Amendments also include \$4.0 million for enrollment growth at James Madison University.

Mr. Chairman, the Subcommittee also recommends \$8.5 million for the Tuition Assistance Grant program which will allow the award to increase to \$4,000 and responsibly restore eligibility for previously exempted online students with a \$2,000 grant reflecting the lower cost of online programs.

Finally, Mr. Chairman, the Subcommittee would like to thank you and Delegate Tyler for your leadership and support in providing for a compensation package in the upcoming fiscal year.

Mr. Chairman, details of our Subcommittee recommendations are attached. I hope that it will be the pleasure of the Committee to adopt them.
