2022 Report of the Subcommittee on General Government The Honorable J. Chapman Petersen, Chair February 20, 2022

Madam Chair and Members of the Committee:

Your Subcommittee has reviewed the provisions of Senate Bills 29 and 30, the budget bills, as introduced, for those portions of the budget that fall under the Subcommittee on General Government. The areas contained within General Government are expansive, touching numerous secretariats and dozens of agencies.

In this brief report, I would like to highlight a few of the key issues in the areas of the Legislative Department, Judicial Department, Administration, Finance, and Central Appropriations.

Under the legislative agencies, the Subcommittee prioritized addressing both physical and cyber security as well as workload, staffing and compensation issues, including a total of \$5.6 million for compensation plans for the Division of Capitol Police and the Division of Legislative Services.

In the Judicial Department, \$5.3 million each year is provided to increase the pay for all district court clerks by \$2,500, and \$15.7 million over the biennium is included to add 120 new general district court clerk positions.

In the area of Administration, the Subcommittee adopted several of the proposals contained in the budget as introduced, including \$89.5 million for a targeted compensation initiative for deputy sheriffs. In addition, \$22.6 million is provided to increase jail per diems for both state and local-responsible offenders.

In the area of Finance, funding is added to provide a full \$1 billion deposit to the Virginia Retirement System to reduce retirement plans' and other post-employment benefits plans' unfunded liabilities, which is projected to save over \$1.7 billion in contribution rate savings over the coming years.

And, in the area of Central Appropriations, in addition to adopting a five percent salary increase for state employees and state-supported local employees in each year of the biennium, \$102.5 million is provided for an additional \$1,000 bonus for state employees to be paid on June 1st of this year.

Madam Chair, this completes the report of the Subcommittee on General Government.
