2024 Report of the Economic Development and Natural Resources Subcommittee The Honorable David W. Marsden, Chair February 18, 2024

Madam Chair and Members of the Committee:

Your Subcommittee has carefully reviewed the Governor's introduced budget for the Secretariats of Agriculture and Forestry, Commerce and Trade, Labor, and Natural Resources. We have thoughtfully considered those proposals, along with those offered by our Senate colleagues.

To ensure that we continue to progress towards connecting all Virginians with broadband, we propose \$29.7 million over the biennium to partially restore funding for the Virginia Telecommunication Initiative. This will position Virginia to meet our goal of affordable, high-speed internet that is accessible to all citizens.

Also, in Commerce and Trade, the Subcommittee recommends fully funding existing economic development incentive commitments and providing support for economically disadvantaged communities through multiple community development investments totaling \$11.0 million.

Our recommendations include several items to strengthen Virginia's top industry, agriculture and forestry. We are proposing an additional \$450,000 to continue the Dairy Producer Price Margin Coverage Premium Program, so that producers are protected during times of market fluctuations.

We are also endorsing budget actions to implement legislation that will consolidate land preservation programs within the Secretariat of Agriculture and Forestry and provide \$5.0 million for the Forest Sustainability Fund to protect working lands.

In keeping with our desire to steward our environment and natural resources, the Subcommittee endorses significant investments of over \$138.0 million in the Water Quality Improvement Fund for agricultural best management practices and \$155.0 million for flood resilience, and we propose funding for a number of new water quality and supply initiatives, including PFAS identification and monitoring, wetlands mitigation banking, and remediation of harmful algal blooms.

As Virginia prepares for the 250th celebration of the American Revolution, the Subcommittee proposes operating support for several museums throughout the Commonwealth and the preservation of significant historical sites.

This completes the report of the Economic Development and Natural Resources Subcommittee. I hope it will be the pleasure of the Committee to adopt our amendments. Respectfully Submitted,

(This amendment restores \$500,000 in each year from the general fund for oyster restoration that was reduced in the introduced budget bill. The amendment authorizes the Marine Resources Commission to use a portion of the funding to support a Potomac River Fisheries Commission project, contingent on matching support from Maryland.)
